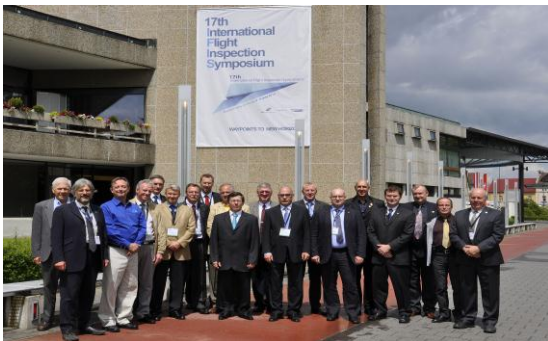
### Accompanying Persons Activities:

## Abstract Guidelines:

Abstracts should be no more than 200 words and must be received on or before January 10, 2014. Authors will be notified of the acceptance of their abstracts by February 10, 2014. Abstracts must be uploaded to the IFIS 2014 website. (Please see *Disclaimer* on the website and *Further Information and Contact Details* at the end of this brochure.)

## Final Papers:

Final papers should be submitted both as a Microsoft Word® document, for publication in the proceedings book, and as a Microsoft PowerPoint® slide show, to be presented during the proceedings. The due date for each is May 1, 2014. Format for papers and presentations and information regarding submissions will be included with each notification of abstract acceptance. This information will also be provided at the event website.

## Aircraft Display:

A static aircraft display will be held at Will Rogers World Airport (KOKC), just 10 minutes from downtown Oklahoma City. ARINC will be hosting the display at their 50,000 square foot hangar and maintenance facility, providing ample ramp space and ground support for aircraft and crews. The static display will provide attendees the opportunity to view various aircraft from both the flight inspection community and the aerospace industry. Transportation to and from the airport will be provided.
